E: extreme risk; immediate action required

H: high risk; senior management attention needed

M: moderate risk; management responsibility must be specified

L: low risk; manage by routine procedures

Control Hierarchy

The control hierarchy is a list of control measures, in priority order, that can be used to eliminate or minimize exposure to hazards. Below is the control hierarchy with general examples of each control measure:

Eliminate

Avoid the risk by removing the hazard completely.

Substitute

Use less hazardous procedure/substances equipment/process.

Isolate

Separate the process from people by the use of barriers/enclosures or distance.

• Engineering Controls

Mechanical/physical changes to equipment/materials/process.

Administrative Controls

Change procedures to reduce exposure to a hazard

Personal Protective Equipment

Supply where required

Definitions

Control Hierarchy – A series of control options ranked towards greatest and most efficient management of the hazard.

Hazard – Something with the potential to cause injury or illness.

Risk – The probability of a hazard resulting in an injury or disease, together with the seriousness of the injury or disease.

Civil Disturbance	Injury to players, staff & public	L	Attendees are aged from 5 to 60 years old – mostly 5-25 – the coach in attendance will ask the intruder to leave or call the police for assistance.	L	Coaches
Armed or dangerous intruder	Injury to players, staff & public	L	See above	L	Coaches
Criminal activity Drunk or rowdy behaviour	Potential injury to Players, Staff, public	L	The Clubs policy is NO DRUG AND ALCOHOL at any training grounds	L	Committee
Broken glass, litter etc.	Potential cuts & lacerations to hands & feet of players & staff	L	Coach to do a walk around before training commences	L	Coach
Ground surface	Injury to players and coaches	L	The Club to liaise with Council and other providers to ensure the grounds are kept in good order	L	Committee
External Emergency	Potential injuries to players, public and staff	L	Coaches will have easy access to mobile phones	L	Committee
Fire	Burn injury & loss if fire breaks out	L	Training will be cancelled if fire is in the area and players will be told to leave if training has already commenced	L	Committee/Coach
Weather extremes	Cold/heat induced illness for participants with inappropriate clothing. Dehydration.	L	Coaches will ensure that all players have adequate water breaks for hydration and ensure that players have enough clothing for the colder days/nights	L	Committee/Coach
Wind/Storm	Bodily injury from flying debris/falling objects to players	L	Training will be cancelled if Lightning is present. It will also be cancelled or abandoned in extreme weather conditions	L	Committee/Coach

Dust	Poor vision Breathing difficulties Equipment failure	L	All players who suffer from Asthma will be required to bring their preventors or other medicine to training. In extreme conditions, training will be cancelled	L	Committee/Coach
Rain	Flooded drains Slippery surfaces	L	If there is a lot of rain, training will be cancelled or moved to an indoor venue	L	Committee/Coach
Medical Emergency and Emergency vehicle access	Potential further injuries to public and staff. Vehicles unable to enter event site due to structures or crowds.	L	Good vehicle access from several directions for all training grounds	L	Committee
Slip, Trip, Fall and Knock	Bodily injury to public or participants	L	A lot of attention is paid to removing or cleaning up any such hazards, if any, before training commences. If someone does get injured, the coaches have some equipment to manage injuries, otherwise an ambulance will be called	L	Committee/Coach
Vehicles travelling within training grounds	Injury to players, staff & public	L	Vehicles park in established car parking and street parking areas.	L	Council/Other Ground Providers/Committee
